School Fee Information 2020

In order to provide our children with quality education and facilities, it is important for every family to contribute financially to the running and upkeep of the school. As part of the enrolment application process you are asked to commit to the payment of all school fees.

General Information

Fees are billed annually in February and are due **in full within 30 days** unless you have a School Fee Agreement in place. Payments by BPay, Direct Debt, Centrepay, Credit Card, Cash, Cheque & EFTPOS are all accepted by the school. A 'School Fee Calculator' is accessible via our website at www.sjedow.catholic.edu.au to assist families to calculate a recurring weekly, fortnightly or monthly amount.

A **Sibling Discount** applies to Tuition Fees and the Building Levy for families with more than one child at the school. All other fees apply to each student. Discounts are as follows:

Tuition Fees:

25% for the 2nd child attending the school
50% for the 3rd child attending the school
100% for the 4th + children attending the school

Building Levy:

50% for the 2nd child attending the school
100% for the 3rd + children attending the school

*Note: The school magazine and the P&F Levy are charged per family
(each family will receive one copy of the magazine.)*

Financial difficulty

At times, it is necessary for families to meet with the Principal to discuss financial hardship. If you find you need to do this, the Principal is available to discuss your situation with you so that a payment plan can be formulated to suit your needs.

Excursions

Excursions are organised to support the students' learning. St John's has a general policy that one excursion per subject will be offered in each year level. There are also some subjects that involve mandatory field trips/excursions. Payment for some large group excursions/events can be made online. Information regarding these will be advised throughout the year. Excursion notes may be accessed on the school website.

Overseas/Non-compulsory Excursions

In accordance with school policy, only students whose fee payments are up to date will be eligible to participate in any overseas excursions.

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Tuition Fees

The Tuition Fee funds teacher's salaries not covered by government funding, and day to day operational costs e.g electricity, water, paper, insurances.

Student Administration Fee

This fee helps cover administration costs associated with each child at the beginning of a new school year.

Reflection Days

Each year group has a Reflection Day each year as part of their Religious Education. These days are usually held at the school. Information will be communicated to parents as the days approach.

Parents & Friends Levy

This fee is charged per family, with the funds being redirected to the P&F Association to enable them to assist with specific projects for the school.

Building Levy

This compulsory fee pays for loans on school buildings and enables us to continue with building projects as the school grows. This fee is payable for each student. NB: This is not a tax deductible item.

Course Fees

Many courses are required to include practical and technological experiences. This fee covers the cost of consumables in a course. CAP (cost of additional project) applies to major works in senior courses. This cost is met by each student and is dependent on the project they choose.

School Magazine

Each family is provided with one copy of the School Magazine. The cost of the magazine includes GST.

External Study Fees

An approximate charge of \$800 to \$1500 per year, depending on the subject, is levied to offset costs for courses provided for senior students attending TAFE outside the school. This is payable before the student is enrolled in the course and is billed separately. Courses studied by Distance Education incur a fee of approximately \$900 per year.
